## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 107TH LEGISLATURE

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1296, L.D. 1567, Bill,
"AN ACT Concerning the Income Requirements for Class A
Restaurants under the Liquor Statutes."

Amend said Bill in subsection 18 by striking out all of the 7th underlined sentence and inserting in place thereof the following:

'In municipalities having a population of 20,000 persons or less, year-round class A restaurants must do a minimum of \$20,000 per year in sale and service of food to the public on their premises and part-time licensees must do a minimum of \$15,000 business in sale or service of food to the public on their premises as a requirement for a part-time license not in excess of 6 consecutive months.'

Further amend said Bill in subsection 18 by striking out all of the 8th and 9th underlined sentences.

## Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to increase requirements for obtaining a class A liquor license in communities with a population of 10,000 or less. The amendment also may provide fewer class A restaurants with liquor licenses in communities with 10,000 people or less compared to the original bill, but the class A restaurants that do operate should be financially more stable and possibly more attractive and inviting.
