SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 476, L.D. 1609, Bill,
"AN ACT to Establish Job Development, Placement and Follow-up
Services in Secondary Schools."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "§1296." by
striking out all of subsection 6 and inserting in place thereof
the following:

'6. Implementation services. The Department of Educational
and Cultural Services and the Department of Manpower Affairs
will provide technical implementation services as requested to
support the public high schools in establishing job development
placement and follow-up programs.'

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "§1296."
by inserting after subsection 6 the following:

'7. Temporary exemption. Schools without the necessary
resources to meet the provisions of this legislation may apply
for a temporary exemption to the Commissioner of Educational
and Cultural Services.'

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "§1296."
by renumbering subsection 7 to be subsection 8.

Statement of Fact

This amendment will allow the Department of Manpower Affairs
to provide technical implementation services. It will also allow
schools without the resources to gain a temporary exemption.
