STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FIVE**

**AN ACT to Exempt the Young Men's Christian Association and the Young
Women's Christian Association from the Sales Tax.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

36 MRSA § 1760, sub-§ 35 is enacted to read:

35. Young Men's Christian Association and Young Women's Christian Association. Sales to the Maine Young Men's Christian Association and to the Maine Young Women's Christian Association and sales to any local association of the Young Men's Christian Association and of the Young Women's Christian Association which is located in Maine.

FISCAL NOTE

It is estimated that passage of this bill will cause a loss of \$22,500 for the first year of the biennium and a loss of \$30,000 for the 2nd year of the biennium.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill exempts both the State and local associations of the YMCA and the YWCA from the sales tax.
