AN ACT to Authorize Barbers to Practice Barbering in a Beauty Shop.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA § 301, sub-§ 3, first sentence, is amended to read:

Cutting of hair, barbering and the practice of barbering shall be done only in a licensed barber shop or in a licensed beauty shop by persons duly registered to practice barbering in this State, except in the following situations:

Sec. 2. 32 MRSA § 301, sub-§ 1, ¶ A, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 373, § 1, is further amended to read:

A. Shaving or trimming the beard, manicuring the fingernails, cutting, arranging, dressing, curling, waving or styling the hair;

Sec. 3. 32 MRSA § 1651 is amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

Any registered barber may practice barbering in such a licensed beauty shop.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow barbers to cut hair and to practice barbering in general in a beauty shop.
