**AN ACT to Appropriate Funds to Provide Continued Alcoholism Services
for the Indian People of Maine.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Indian Affairs the sum of \$280,000 for the purposes of providing alcoholism services for the Indian people. The breakdown shall be as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide continued alcoholic services to Maine Indians. These services have been funded in the past by administrative funds given to the Division of Alcoholism Services of the Department of Health and Welfare and E.E.A. funds.

These funds would provide for 10 alcoholism counsellors and backup services for them. The funds in the "All Other" category would be used for temporary aid in the form of food, clothing, and other necessities for families of alcoholics living off reservations.
