**AN ACT to Require that an Arrested Person be Allowed to Make a
Telephone Call at No Cost to the County or Municipality.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

15 MRSA § 708-A is enacted to read:

§ 708-A. Telephone call by arrested person

Every person arrested for an offense shall be allowed to make and complete at least one telephone call to a person of his choice, provided such call shall not be at the expense of the municipality or county.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow a person arrested to make at least one telephone call at no expense to the municipality or county.
