STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Exempting Members of Maine's Indian Tribes from the Atlantic Salmon Fishing Stamp Fee.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2552, sub-§ 7, ¶ A, 1st sentence, as repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 297, § 1, is amended to read:

An Atlantic Salmon stamp shall be issued by the commissioner to fish for Atlantic salmon under this chapter, the fee for which stamp shall be \$1 for any resident of this State, excluding members of Maine's Indian tribes who shall be exempt from the fee, 16 years of age or older, and \$15 for any non-resident, 16 years or older.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of this Act it to exempt Maine's Indians from the fee charged for an Atlantic Salmon fishing license.
