IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Provide Complimentary Fishing and Hunting Licenses for
Retired Game Wardens.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2401-B, sub-§ 13-A is enacted to read:

13-A. Complimentary licenses to retired game wardens. A complimentary license to hunt or fish, or a combination hunting and fishing license shall be issued to any inland fish and game warden retired under the provisions of the State Retirement System, who is a resident of the State and applies therefor to the commissioner. Such application shall be accompanied by certified evidence that the applicant is a retired inland fish and game warden, and that the applicant has eyesight of at least 20/60 vision, with or without correction, in one eye.

FISCAL NOTE

This bill will mean an annual revenue loss of approximately \$945.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow retired inland fisheries and game wardens to have complimentary fishing and hunting licenses.
