HOUSE AMENDMENT " G " to S.P. 480, L.D. 1760, Bill,
"AN ACT to Correct Errors and Inconsistencies in the Public
Laws."

Amend said Bill by inserting after section 8 the
following:

'Sec. 8-B-1. 12 MRSA §2401-B, sub-§7, first sentence,
as last amended by PL 1975, c. 97, §1, is further amended
to read:

'The commissioner (Inland Fisheries and Game) shall issue a hunting
trapping and fishing license to any Indian over the age of
10 years of the Passamaquoddy, Penobscot, Maliseet or
Micmac Tribes without any charge or fee, providing the Indian
presents a certificate from the respective reservation governor
or the President of the Association of Aroostook Indians stating
that the person described is an Indian and a member of that
tribe.

Sec. 8-B-2. Effective date. Section 8-B-1 shall become
effective 91 days after the adjournment of the Legislature.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment provides for certification authority by
the President of the Association of Aroostook Indians for
Maliseet and Micmac tribe members who wish to obtain special
Fish and Game licenses. The provision of chapter 97 of the
public laws of 1975 provides for certification by reservation
governors only, but neither the Maliseets nor the Micmacs live
on reservations and thus/^{the}association must accomplish the

certification.
