HOUSE AMENDMENT"^A "to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT"A" to H.P. 1401, L.D. 1787, Bill, "AN ACT to Establish the Uniform Crime Victims Reparations Act."

Amend said amendment by inserting in the 2nd sentence of that part designated "<u>§4206.</u>" after the words "<u>for</u> <u>medical care</u>" the following: '<u>or nonmedical remedial care</u> <u>and treatment rendered in accordance with a recognized</u> religious method of healing'

Further amend said amendment by inserting in the 2nd line of the 2nd paragraph of that part designated "<u>§4209.</u>" after the underlined words "<u>incurred for medical</u>" the following: '<u>or nonmedical remedial care and treatment</u> rendered in accordance with a recognized religious method of healing'

Statement of Fact

Since the whole purpose of this bill is to aid the victim of a crime, it's important to be sure that a victim isn't discriminated against and denied compensation because he relies on prayer and spiritual means alone for healing instead of medical care. This amendment would provide comparable protection and benefits for those who rely on Christian Science care and treatment as those who rely on medical treatment.

Insurance companies have long provided such benefits

because they have found Christian Science treatment and care to be an effective means of healing. Christian Science care and treatment is also included under Medicare, the Federal Government-wide Indemnity Benefit Plan and the Federal Military Medical Benefits Program.
