SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to H.P. 1421, L.D. 1806, RESOLUTION,
Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Provide for
Direct Initiative for Proposed Amendments to the Constitution.

Amend said Resolution by striking out in the 12th
line of the 4th paragraph (11th line in L.D.) the underlined
word "one-half" and inserting in place thereof the underlined words
'a majority'


Further amend said Resolution by striking out in the 3rd
line from the end of the 4th paragraph the underlined words
"a majority" and inserting in place thereof the underlined
word 'two-thirds'

Statement of Fact

This amendment provides that for an initiated constitutional
amendment to be sent to the people, it must be passed by a vote
of the majority of all members elected to each House of the
Legislature and further provides that two-thirds of those voting
on the proposed amendment must be in favor of the amendment
before it becomes law.
