## STATE OF MAINE SENATE 107TH LEGISLATURE

SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 1425, L.D. 1817, Bill, "AN ACT to Revise the Fish and Game Laws."

Amend said Bill by inserting after section 13 the following:

'Sec. 13-A. 12 MRSA §2401, sub-§3, ¶¶ G and H are enacted to read:

G. Serviceman's big game

Permits any person serving
in the Armed Forces of the
United States who is permanently
stationed at a military or naval
post, station or base within the
State, that person's spouse and
that person's children to hunt big
game, provided that spouse and
children permanently reside with
that person.

H. Serviceman's seasonal fishing

Permits any person serving in
the Armed Forces of the United

States who is permanently stationed
at a military or naval post, station
or base within the State, that person's
spouse and that person's children to
fish during the season for which the
license is issued, provided that
spouse and children permanently reside
with that person.

## Statement of Fact

This amendment establishes a special big game hunting license category, with a license fee of \$13.50, which permits big game hunting by any person serving in the Armed Forces of the United States who is permanently stationed at a military or naval post, station or base within this State. This amendment also establishes a seasonal fishing license category, with a license fee of \$8.50, for the same class of serviceman. These

license fees are the same as resident fees for the same categories.
