SENATE AMENDMENT "C " to H.P. 1510, L.D.1827, RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Provide for Annual Sessions of the Legislature and to Change the Date of Convening of the Legislature.

Amend said Resolution in the Title by inserting after the words "Annual Sessions of the Legislature" the words 'with Limits on the Matters which may be Considered in the Second Regular Session of Each Biennium'

Further amend said Resolution by inserting at the end of the first sentence after the underlined word "Legislature" in that part amending the Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. 3, §1, the following:

'; provided, however, that the business of the second regular session of the Legislature shall be limited to budgetary matters; legislation in the Governor's call; legislation of an emergency nature admitted by the Legislature; and legislation referred to committees for study and report by the Legislature in the first regular session'

Further amend said Resolution by striking out all of the 3rd paragraph from the end, before the Statement of Fact, and inserting in place thereof the following:

"Shall the Constitution be amended as proposed by a resolution of the Legislature to provide for annual sessions of the Legislature with limits on the matters which may be considered in the second regular session of each biennium and to change the date of the convening of the Legislature?"

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to limit the matters which may be considered in the second regular session of the Legislature.
