SENATE AMENDMENT " E " to H.P. 1521, L.D. 1834,
Bill, "AN ACT to Increase the Minimum Wage to
\$2.30 an Hour."

Amend said Bill in the Title by inserting at the
end, before the period, the following:

'and to Exempt Campgrounds from the Overtime
Provisions of the Minimum Wage Statute'

Further amend said Bill by inserting after
the enacting clause at the beginning of the
first line the underlined abbreviation and figure
'Sec. 1.'

Further amend said Bill by inserting at
the end, before the Statement of Fact, the
following:

'Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §664, first ¶, last sentence,
as last repealed and replaced by PL 1969, c. 590,
§41, is amended to read:

The overtime provision of this section shall not
apply to seamen, the canning, processing,
preserving, freezing, drying, marketing, storing,
packing for shipment or distribution of herring
as sardines, of perishable foods, of agricultural
produce, and meat and fish products, nor to the
canning of perishable goods, nor to hotels,
motels, campgrounds, restaurants and other
eating establishments.'
