

SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 514, L.D. 1876, Bill,
"AN ACT to Specify which Activities on Lands Adjacent to Great
Ponds, Rivers, Streams and Brooks Need Permits."

Amend said Bill in section 1 by striking out in the 8th
line (7th line in L.D.) the underlined word "tidewater" and
inserting in place thereof the underlined words 'head of tide'

Statement of Fact

This amendment is intended to clarify the line on rivers,
etc. between the jurisdiction of the Department of Inland
Fisheries and Game and the Department of Environmental Protection.
The head of tide is essentially the most up-stream place in the
river, etc. affected by tidal action.
