

SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to H.P. 1725, L.D. 1939, Bill,  
"AN ACT to Reform the State Retirement System."

Amend said Bill in section 45 by striking out in the 5th and 6th lines after the amending clause (same in L.D.) the words and punctuation "who was his spouse at the time of his retirement," and inserting in place thereof the following stricken out words and punctuation: '~~who was his spouse at the time of his retirement,~~'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to remove the one inconsistency presently in the law between survivor's benefits for State Police officers and the same benefits for Inland Fisheries and Game wardens or coastal wardens. Presently, the spouse of a State Police officer who marries the officer after his retirement receives survivor's benefits and the spouse of a warden in an identical situation will not receive those benefits. This amendment gives such spouse those benefits.
