Amend said Bill in the Title by inserting at the end, before the period, the following. 'and to Provide for the Reduction and Transfer of Funds in Other Accounts'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the 7th and 8th line after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'All Other

Further amend said Bill by inserting after the last paragraph before the emergency clause the following:

Provides matching funds for up to 4 additional staff or assistant attorneys general in the Department of Human Services, said attorneys, as well as those positions being transferred, to be appointed by and under the supervision of the Attorney General.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to reduce appropriations in inventory tax reimbursement to municipalities and Elderly Householders Tax and Rent Refund accounts. All obligations have been met and the funds are no longer needed for that purpose.

The transfer of funds from the Attorney General to the Department of Human Services is necessitated by new federal legislation requiring the Department of Human Services to collect all support payments from absent parents.
