RESOLVE, to Adjust the Retirement Status under the State Retirement

Law of Albert W. Hallowell of Owls Head.

Albert W. Hallowell of Owls Head; retirement status adjustment. Resolved: That notwithstanding any other provision of law, the duties, rights and benefits of Albert W. Hallowell of Owls Head, under the Maine State Retirement System, shall be those of a law enforcement officer in the Department of Marine Resources during the period Albert W. Hallowell of Owls Head has served and continues to serve as a boat captain with the department.

FISCAL NOTE

This resolve will not result in any additional expense to the Retirement System, other than the usual difference in state contributions between a law enforcement officer and a regular member.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Albert W. Hallowell was hired by the Department of Marine Resources on April 22, 1963 as a boat captain. He was hired under an agreement that this position was part of the Law Enforcement Division of the department. His contributions to the Retirement System have been those required by a law enforcement officer since his hiring. However, Mr. Hallowell never undertook the required training nor was he officially commissioned as a coastal warden; and thus he has been denied that status under the Retirement System.
