COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1884, L.D. 2062, Bill,
"AN ACT Concerning the Purchase of Liquor."

Amend said Bill by inserting before the enacting clause
the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature
do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless
enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, licensees in close proximity to the Kittery
state retail liquor store must travel a great distance to the
nearest state retail liquor store to purchase liquor for resale; and

Whereas, the state retail liquor stores in the surrounding
areas do not contain the quantity and variety of liquors that
the Kittery state retail liquor store offers and which licensees
require to operate their businesses; and

Whereas, licensees could purchase liquors for resale purposes
at the Kittery state retail liquor store without creating any
administrative and enforcement problems; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
safety; now, therefore, '

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the end, before the Statement of Fact, the following:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

The purpose of this amendment is to make the bill an emergency measure.
