IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SIX

AN ACT to Extend the Exemption for Self-employed Sternmen on Lobster Fishing Boats from Coverage under the Employment Security and Workmen's Compensation Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 26 MRSA § 1043, sub-§ 11, ¶ F, sub-¶ (32), is enacted to read:

(43) Services performed by an individual operating as a sternman, as defined in Title 36, section 5102, subsection 8-A, on a lobster or crab fishing vessel of less than 10 tons.

Sec. 2. 39 MRSA § 2, sub-§ 5, ¶ A, is amended to read:

A. Persons engaged in maritime employment, or in interstate or foreign commerce, who are within the exclusive jurisdiction of admiralty law or the laws of the United States and persons self-employed as sternmen on lobster boats as defined in Title 36, section 5102, subsection 8-A.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The 107th Legislature ratified the longstanding practice of self-employment of lobster boat sternmen by passing an Act to exempt boat owners from withholding state income taxes for sternmen. This bill will complete the exemp-

tion so that sternmen will be recognized as self-employed for all state purposes. Section I will exempt sternmen from unemployment insurance coverage and is consistent with the general philosophy of that program not to cover persons who are self-employed. Section 2 will exempt them from State Workmen's Compensation Program, which provides coverage only when they are on land.
