

## STATE OF MAINE SENATE 107TH LEGISLATURE FIRST SPECIAL SESSION

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT"A " to S.P. 661, L.D. 2086, RESOLVE, Authorizing the Bureau of Public Lands to Convey the State's Interest in 4 Lots in Kingman, Penobscot County.

Amend said resolve by striking out the entire first paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Transfer title of the State for 4 lots in Kingman Township. Resolved: That the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands, Department of Conservation, is authorized to sell, subject to the approval of the Governor and Council, by quitclaim deed all right, title and interest of the State in Lots 14, 15 and 19 south of Marginal Street and Lot 4 north of Pine Street as laid down on Sewall's Tax Plans 3 and 2 of Kingman Township for an amount determined by the director to be fair market value. The director shall cause notice to be published of the availability of the said lots in a newspaper of general circulation in the area in advance of any sale thereof.'

## Statement of Fact

The subject property was acquired by the Plantation of Kingman as a result of tax liens dated February 11, 1938, July 14, 1942 and June 2, 1943. In 1945, the Plantation of Kingman was deorganized. The plantation's interest in these lots was

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then acquired by the State of Maine. The State Bureau of Taxation has never sold these lots. This resolve provides for the sale of the property.
