HOUSE AMENDMENT "8" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1933, L.D.
2121, Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify the Fish and Game Laws."

Amend said amendment by striking out all of the 9th paragraph
and inserting in place thereof the following:

'It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons hunting together,
to use more than 4 6 dogs at any one time for the purpose of hunting
bear. In order for any nonresident to hunt bear with dogs, that non-
resident shall be accompanied at all times by a resident registered
Maine Guide. At no time shall the number in a party hiring a resident
registered Maine Guide under this section exceed 8 persons.'

Further amend said amendment by striking out all of the 15th
paragraph.

Statement of Fact
nonresident

This amendment provides that any / hunting bear with dogs shall
be accompanied by a resident registered Maine Guide, and further
provides that a party hunting bear with dogs and accompanied by such
a guide shall not exceed 8 persons. The amendment also deletes the
increase in the salmon stamp fee.
