IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SIX

AN ACT Prohibiting the Use of Seine or Gill Nets on a Certain Portion of the Union River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2757 is enacted to read:

§ 2757. Use of seine or gill nets on Union River

It shall be unlawful for anyone to use a seine or gill net in the Union River above a line drawn from Weymouth Point in the Town of Surry to the Ellsworth-Trenton town line on the east side of the Union River.
