COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1953, L.D. 2138, Bill,
"AN ACT to Exempt Emergency Vehicles and School Buses From the
Statutory Prohibition of the Use of Studded Tires From May to
October."

Amend said Bill by striking out the entire sentence after
the amending clause and inserting in place thereof the follow-
ing:

'It shall be unlawful to operate a motor vehicle or combination
of vehicles, except for fire department vehicles and except for
school buses during the months school is in regular session, with
tires having any metal studs, wires or spikes protruding from the
tire tread or any other metal protuberance from the tire tread
upon any public highway during the period from the first day of
May to the first day of October.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to increase the amount of
time school buses may use tires with metal studs or similar pro-
←-tuberances. This amount of additional time will equal the
additional days a school's regular session lasts beyond May 1st
and the number of days the session begins before October 1st.
