AN ACT Relating to Methods of Posting of Land Against Hunting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2469 is enacted to read:

§ 2469. Posting of land against hunting

The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall, in accordance with this Title and other applicable provisions of law, promulgate regulations providing for reasonable methods of posting lands against hunting. These regulations shall include provisions for posting land against hunting by means of signs or by means of paint, and shall also include the types and colors of paint which may be used to post land.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to promulgate regulations for the posting of land against hunting. These regulations shall permit the use of paint to post land against hunting.
