COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1968, L.D. 2157,
RESOLVE, Authorizing the Exchange of Certain Lands in the
Capitol Complex as Recommended by the Capitol Planning
Commission.

Amend said Resolve by inserting after the title, the
following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature
do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment
unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Maine State Employees Credit Union recently
purchased property with the intent to locate a facility in the
State Capitol Complex; and

Whereas, the Capitol Planning Commission believes that such
location could create a conflict and that statutory
permission to exchange property is likely to resolve the
conflict; and

Whereas, expeditious resolution of this conflict may
permit both the State and the Credit Union to avoid expense
and inconvenience; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution
of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
safety; now, therefore, be it'

Further amend said Resolve in the 8th line (7th line of L.D.) by striking out the figures "0.42" and inserting in place thereof the figures '0.33'

Further amend said Resolve in the 3rd line from the end (same in L.D.) by striking out the word "shall" and inserting in place thereof the word 'may'

Further amend said Resolve by inserting at the end, before the Statement of Fact, the following:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Resolve shall take effect when approved.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment adds an emergency preamble and an emergency clause to the Resolve, changes the acreage description of the Packard property from 0.42 to 0.33 acres and provides that any additional payment resulting from appraisal differences may be taken from the Purchase of Property Account.
