STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SIX

AN ACT to Designate Certain Rivers as Salmon Trophy Rivers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2552, sub-§ 7, ¶ B is enacted to read:

- B. Salmon trophy rivers. The following rivers of the State are designated salmon trophy rivers, and in the portions set forth Atlantic sea run salmon shall be taken by means of fly fishing only:
 - The Denny's River from Meddybemps to tidewater; (I)
 - The East Machias River from 2 red markers approximately 400 yards above the Route I bridge to tidewater;
 - (3)The Machias River from East Machias Lake to tidewater:
 - The Pleasant River from Saco Falls to tidewater; (4)
 - (5) The Narraguagus River from Route 9 to the bridge at Route 1;
- (6) The Penobscot River from the Old Town-Milford Dam to tidewater; and
 - (7) The Sheepscot River from Head Tide Dam to tidewater.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill designates certain Maine rivers as salmon trophy rivers and states that in the portions of those rivers set forth in the bill, Atlantic sea run salmon may be taken by means of fly fishing only.
