SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 2022, L.D. 2201, Bill,  
"AN ACT to Establish a Division of Travel Information."

Amend said Bill in section 5 by striking out all of  
subsection 1 of that part designated "\$4214." and inserting  
in place thereof the following:

'1. Definition. To provide funds for the operation of the division  
there is established a fund to be known as the Maine Travel  
Information Fund. The fund shall include all revenues received  
from an annual license fee that shall be imposed upon each holder  
of a retail sellers license certificate as issued by the Bureau  
of Taxation for sales and use tax law on collections as defined  
in Title 36, section 1754.

Said license fees shall be collected by the Bureau of Taxation  
and shall be effective July 1, 1976.

Forms for application for registration shall be prescribed and  
furnished by the State Tax Assessor. The seller shall pay the sum  
of \$30 annually for each place of business conducted by him  
in this State.

Unexpended balances of the Maine Travel Information Fund shall be  
deemed nonlapsing carrying accounts.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of sections 6 and 7.

Further amend said Bill by renumbering section 8 to be section 6.

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the emergency preamble and all of the emergency clause.

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to substitute a license fee in place of  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 1% self-imposed sales tax.
