COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 701, L.D. 2220, Bill,
"AN ACT to Promote the Sale of Maine Potatoes."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of sections 1 and
2 and renumbering sections 3 and 4 to read sections 1 and 2.

Statement of Fact

The intent of this amendment is to remove the provisions that require each packer of potatoes to place the name of the packing firm or the individual packer's name on each bag of potatoes. Logistics make it very difficult to implement these provisions without great expense to the shipper or grower or both.
