STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SIX

AN ACT to Prohibit Payment of Dependency Allowance to Persons with a Spouse Employed Full Time.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA § 1191, sub-§ 6, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 568, § 2, is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

No individual shall be eligible to receive dependency allowances as provided in this subsection for any week during which his spouse is employed full time.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides for supplemental weekly allowances for dependents to be paid only in the event that the claimant's spouse is not employed on a full-time basis.
