HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 777, L.D. 2334, Bill, "AN ACT to Revise the Maine Criminal Code as Recommended by the Criminal Law Revision Commission."

Amend said Bill by inserting after section 102 the following:

'Sec. 103. 17-A MRSA §1107, sub-~~§1~~<sup>¶¶A and B,</sup> as enacted by PL 1975, c. 499, §1, are repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

- A. Expressly authorized by Title 22;
- B. Expressly made a civil violation by Title 22; or
- C. Subject to section 1107-A.

Sec. 104. 17-A MRSA §1107-A is enacted to read:  
§1107-A. Possession of usable amount of marijuana  
Possession of a usable amount of marijuana is a Class E crime.'

Further amend said Bill by inserting after section 125 the following:

'Sec. 126. 22 MRSA §2383, as / <sup>repealed and replaced</sup> by PL 1975, c. 499, §51 is repealed.'

Further amend said Bill by renumbering/<sup>the</sup> sections to read consecutively.

Statement of Fact

This amendment makes possession of a usable amount of marijuana a Class E crime under the Criminal Code.
