IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Reorganize the Standardization Committee.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

5 MRSA § 1814, first ¶, as amended by PL 1969, c. 300, § 2, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

A Standardization Committee as heretofore established shall consist of the Governor or his representative, the State Purchasing Agent, 3 public members and one department or agency head, or his representative, designated by the Governor. The 3 public members shall not be state employees and shall be appointed by the Governor from a list of names provided by a recognized association representing professionals in the field of purchasing. The State Purchasing Agent shall be an ex officio member of the committee and shall not have a vote within the committee. The 3 public members and the department or agency head, or his representative, shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill reorganizes the Standardization Committee and provides for a majority and membership of nonstate employees.
