SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to House Amendment "A", to H.P. 17, L.D. 26, Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify the Laws Governing Vehicles Overtaking and Passing."

after the first 2 lines Amend the amendment by striking out everything and inserting in its place the following:

'Amend the Bill in section 3 in that part designated "§1151-B" by inserting at the end the following new sentence:

During the hours from 1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise, a driver instead of giving any audible warning, may signal by flashing his headlights within 3 seconds from low to high beam and back to low beam.'

## Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to clarify the intention of House Amendment "A" by retaining the requirement for an audible signal on passing except in the nighttime when the signal may be made by flashing the headlights.
