HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 17, L.D. 26, Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify the Laws Governing Vehicles Overtaking and Passing."

Amend the Bill by striking out all of that part designated "§1151-B." and inserting in its place the following:
'§1151-B. Audible signal on passing

During the hours from 1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise, a driver instead of giving any audible warning, may signal by flashing his headlights within 3 seconds from low beam to high beam and back to low beam.'

## Statement of Fact

This amendment permits flashing of headlights instead of honking your horn as a nighttime passing signal.
