COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to H.P. 26, L.D. 35, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Sawdust and Shavings being Transported on Public Ways."

Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

'29 MRSA §1752 is amended by inserting at the end the following new sentence:

When the load consists of sawdust, shavings or wood chips, and a reasonable effort has been made to completely cover such load, minor amounts of such a load which are wind blown from the vehicle while in transit shall not constitute a violation.'

## Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide that if a reasonable effort has been made to cover an entire load of sawdust, shavings or wood chips, minor amounts of windblown material will not comprise a violation of the secured load law. If loads of sawdust, shavings or chips were exempted from the law completely, precautions might not be taken to prevent the contents from onto spilling / the road.
