COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to H.P. 34, L.D. 51, Bill, "AN
ACT Concerning Bear Hunting with Dogs."

Amend the Bill in that part designated "§2355-D." by
inserting at the end of the first underlined paragraph the
following sentence: 'No such hunting party shall exceed 6
persons, excluding a registered Maine guide when such guide is
used.'

Further amend the Bill in that part designated "§2355-D."
by striking out all of the last underlined paragraph and inserting
in its place the following:

'Any nonresident hunting bear with dogs shall be accompanied
by a resident registered Maine guide.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment limits the size of a hunting party using dogs
to hunt bear to 6 persons, excluding the guide. This amendment
also specifies that all nonresidents using dogs to hunt bear
must be accompanied by a registered Maine guide who is a resident
of Maine.
