**AN ACT to Revise Restrictions in Allowing Reciprocity with Licensed
Hairdressers in Certain States and Provide Greater Flexibility for State
of Maine Licensees.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

32 MRSA § 1654, as amended by PL 1975, c. 119, § 4, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§ 1654. Registration without examination

Upon the payment of a fee of \$30, the board may grant to any other state full reciprocity with respect to persons practicing cosmetology in this State when those persons are properly licensed and registered under the laws of that state and are physically qualified, and when that other state extends under its laws or rules and regulations like privileges to persons practicing cosmetology in this State who are properly licensed and registered by this State. The term "any other state," as used in this section, includes any state, district, county or other sovereignty. The board may promulgate rules and regulations for the administration and enforcement of this section, and all these rules and regulations shall have the full force and effect of law.

FISCAL NOTE

It is estimated that passage of this bill would increase revenue to the Board of Cosmetology by \$6,000 per fiscal year.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill revises restrictions in allowing reciprocity with licensed hairdressers in certain states and provides greater flexibility for Maine cosmetology licensees.
