STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing Funds for Repair of Olamon Stream Dam in the Town of Greenbush, Penobscot County.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and Resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Olamon Stream Dam is badly in need of repair; and

Whereas, these repairs are vitally necessary to protect and preserve the Olamon Stream watershed as a place of wild beauty for present and future generations, to promote all seasons family recreation and sport, and to provide wildlife habitat; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Funds for repair of Olamon Stream Dam, Penobscot County; provided. Resolved: That there is appropriated to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife from the General Fund the sum of \$40,000 to repair the Olamon Stream Dam in the Town of Greenbush, Penobscot County.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this resolve is reflected in the emergency preamble.
