SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 70, L.D. 94, Bill, "AN ACT to Increase the Exemption on Estates of Veterans."

Amend the Amendment by striking out all of section 1 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §653, sub-§1, ¶C, 1st sentence, as amended by PL 1975, c. 550, §1, is further amended to read:

The estates up to the just value of \$4,000 for the 1978 tax year and \$6,000 for each tax year thereafter, having a taxable situs in the place of residence, of veterans who served in the Armed Forces of the United States during any federally recognized war period during or before World War I, including-the-Kerean-Campaign-and-the-Viet-Nam-War, when they shall have reached the age of 62 years or when they are receiving any form of pension or compensation from the United States Government for total disability, service-connected or non-service-connected, as a veteran during any federally recognized war period during or before World War I.

Further amend the amendment in section 2, in paragraph D,
before the period,
in the 7th line by inserting after the word "veteran"/the
following:

'in any federally recognized war period/or before World
War I '

Further amend the amendment in the last line before the before the punctuation, Fiscal Note by inserting after the word "son"/the following:

'during any federally recognized war period during or before
World War I '

This amendment limits the exemption to veterans, their any widows or minor children who served during/federally recognized war period during or before World War I.
