SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 113, L.D. 143, Bill,

"AN ACT Revising the Disqualification Periods for Persons
who Voluntarily Quit Work or are Discharged for Misconduct."

Amend the Bill in section 1 in the 10th line (7th line in L.D.) by striking out the underlined figure "8" and inserting in its place the underlined figure '4'

Further amend the Bill by inserting after section ${\bf 1}$ the following:

'Sec. 1-A.26 MRSA §1193, sub-§1, ¶A, last sentence, as enacted by PL 1965, c. 381, §13, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Leaving work shall not be considered voluntary without good cause when it is caused by the illness or disability of the claimant or of his immediate family and the claimant took all reasonable precautions to protect his employment status by having promptly notified his employer as to the reason for his absence and by promptly requesting reemployment when he is again able to resume employment; nor shall leaving work be considered voluntary without good cause if the leaving was necessary for the claimant to accompany, follow or join his spouse in a new place of residence and he can clearly show upon arrival at the new place of residence an attachment to the new labor market and is in all respects able, available and actively seeking suitable work;

Further amend the Bill in section 2 in the last line (next to last line in L.D.) by striking out the underlined figure "8" and inserting in its place the underlined figure '4'

Statement of Fact

This amendment reduces the earning requirement for requalification from 8 to 4 times the person's weekly benefit amount. The amendment also removes any disqualification from persons who must leave work to take care of an immediate family member or to accompany a spouse to a new residence.
