STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend the Maine Human Rights Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA § 4566, sub-§ 3, as enacted by PL 1971, c. 501, § 1, is amended by adding at the end the following new sentence to read:

The commission shall hire an investigator who shall be responsible solely for cases related to age discrimination.

- Sec. 2. 5 MRSA § 4573, sub-§ 1, ¶¶ A, B and C, as enacted by PL 1971, c. 501, § 1, are repealed.
- Sec. 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Maine Human Rights Commission the sum of \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1978 for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow the Maine Human Rights Commission to expand their review of alleged age discrimination complaints on a case by case basis and to provide one staff investigator for that purpose. It does not

make unlawful any employment policy which presently exists. This bill was developed from a resolution passed by the 1,200 elderly delegates at the Maine Committee on Aging's 1976 Blaine House Conference on Aging.
