## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 108TH LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 174, L.D. 212, Bill, "AN ACT to Recognize Mopeds as being in a Different Classification than Motorcycles."

Amend the Amendment by inserting after section 4 the following:

'Sec. 5. 29 MRSA \$1373-A is enacted to read:

§1373-A. Protective headgear available

Every person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of renting mopeds for use by the general public shall have sufficient quantity of protective headgear available, as part of the rental agreement, for individuals who request such headgear at the time of renting such a moped.'

Further amend the Amendment by renumbering section 5 to be section 6.

## Statement of Fact

This amendment requires that any individual, firm or corporation renting mopeds also provide protective headgear for anyone who wishes such protection when renting a moped. Protective headgear would include both bicycle and motorcycle helmets.

This amendment does not require anyone to wear protective

headgear. It is a completely voluntary measure which simply requires one safety option be made available.
