COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 193, L.D. 255, Bill, "AN  
ACT Concerning Prosecution of Fish and Wildlife Law Violators  
Who are 16 Years of Age or Older."

Amend the Bill in ~~Section 2~~  
by striking out everything after the amending clause and  
inserting in its place the following:

'Juvenile courts shall have no jurisdiction over offenses  
in which any juvenile, who has attained his sixteenth  
birthday, is charged with the violation of any provision  
relating to inland fish and wildlife contained in Title 12,  
chapters 301 through 337, or Marine Resources contained in  
Title 12, chapters 401 through 419.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide that any  
juvenile who is 16. . . years of age and violates any provision  
of Title 12, chapters 401 through 419 (Marine Resources  
Statutes) will be treated as an adult in the Courts.
