COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to H.P. 260, L.D. 328, Bill,
"AN ACT Permitting Reciprocity with States that Issue
Complimentary Hunting and Fishing Licenses to a Person who
is Suffering from Paraplegia or who is Suffering from Loss
of or the Loss of the Use of Both Lower Extremities."

Amend the Bill by striking out all of the 3rd line and
inserting in its place the following:

'18. Paraplegics; resident and nonresident licenses; reciprocity.'

Further amend the Bill by striking out all of the first underlin
sentence of subsection 18 and inserting in its place the following:

'The commissioner may issue upon application complimentary
resident hunting and fishing licenses to a person who is a
resident of Maine, and complimentary nonresident hunting and
fishing licenses to a person from another state, who is
suffering from paraplegia or who is suffering from the loss of,
or the loss of the use of both lower extremities, provided
that the state where the person applying for a complimentary
nonresident license resides provides a reciprocal privilege for
residents of this State who are similarly suffering.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide complimentary
hunting and fishing licenses to Maine residents who are
suffering from paraplegia or loss of or the loss of the use of
both lower extremities.
