STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Limiting to 8 the Number of Dogs which may be used to Hunt Bear.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2355-D, as amended by PL 1975, c. 266, § 2, is further amended to read:

§ 2355-D. Hunting bear with dogs

It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons hunting together, to use more than $\neq 8$ dogs at any one time for the purpose of hunting bear.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to increase from 4 to 8 the maximum number of dogs allowed for the purpose of hunting bear.
