IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Establishing Retirement Age for State Fire Inspectors at 55 Years.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

5 MRSA § 1121, sub-§ 4, ¶ E is enacted to read:

E. Any member who is a state fire inspector, a state fire marshal or assistant state fire marshal and has 25 years or more of creditable service in his respective capacity may, on or after the attainment of age 55, and must, at the attainment of age 65, retire on a service retirement allowance which will be equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ of his average final compensation, plus an additional 2% of his average final compensation for each year of membership service not included in the age and service conditions for retirement under this paragraph.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow the State Fire Marshal, Assistant State Fire Marshal and State Fire Inspectors to retire at age 55, with 25 years of creditable service.
