SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 324, L.D. 415, Bill, "AN ACT to Define "North American Indians Residing in Maine" for Purposes of the North American Indian Scholarships."

Amend the Bill by striking out all of the last underlined paragraph before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

'As used in this chapter, "North American Indians residing in Maine" shall be deemed to include those persons who can prove 1/4 Indian blood and who have resided in the State of Maine during the 5 consecutive years next preceding their application for a scholarship.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide that any person who can prove 1/4 Indian blood and who has lived in the State for 5 years is eligible to receive a scholarship under the North American Indian Scholarship Fund.
