STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Concerning the Disposition of Human Remains.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA § 2841, sub-§ 1, first sentence is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

The funeral director who first assumes custody of a fetus shall be responsible for filing the certificate.

Sec. 2. 22 MRSA § 2842, sub-§ 1, first sentence is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

The funeral director in charge of the disposition of the dead human body or its removal from the State shall be responsible for filing the certificate.

Sec. 3. 22 MRSA § 2843, first ¶ is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Except as authorized by the department, no dead human body shall be buried, cremated or otherwise disposed of or removed from the State until a licensed funeral director in charge of such final disposition or removal has obtained a permit from the clerk of the municipality where death occurred.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to prohibit a person from practicing funeral services unless a license is issued to him by the State Board of Funeral Services under Title 32, chapter 21.
