SENATE AMENDMENT "C " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 517,  
L.D. 635, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Corporal Punishment."

Amend the Amendment by striking out all of the last line  
before the Statement of Fact and inserting in its place the  
following:

'of force. This subsection shall not be construed to justify  
the use of force by a teacher to prevent or punish misconduct by a  
student who has a mental or physical handicap, as defined in  
Title 5, section 4553, or who is a member of a special education  
program, as defined in Title 20, section 3743.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment states that a teacher is not justified in  
using corporal punishment against a student with a physical or  
mental handicap, as defined in the Human Rights Act, or who is a  
member of a special education class, as defined under the education  
laws.
