STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 108th LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT"/ "to H.P. 550, L.D. 667, Bill, "AN ACT Concerning Fly Fishing in the Kennebec River."

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting in its place the following:

'<u>Emergency preamble</u>. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, because of an oversight the existing laws now prohibit fly fishing on this portion of the Kennebec River; and

Whereas, fly fishing on the Kennebec River has been traditional recreation enjoyed by many sportsmen for many years; and

Whereas, allowing this bill to become effective 90 days after adjournment would result in the bill becoming effective in the middle of the fly fishing season; and

Whereas, allowing this bill to become effective in the middle of the season would create confusion and misunderstanding among sportsmen and would create great difficulties for officials responsible for the enforcement of fisheries and wildlife laws; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT"4"to H.P. 550, L.D. 667

12 MRSA §2553-A, as repealed by PL 1975, c. 772, §17, is reenacted to read:

§2553-A. Fly fishing in Kennebec River

Kennebec River, downstream from Indian Pond dam in <u>Tl R6, Somerset County to tidewater in Augusta, Kennebec</u> <u>County, from September 15th to October 31st of each year, shall</u> <u>be open to flyfishing only for all fish with a one-fish daily</u> limit.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall become effective when approved.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to correct language which would have closed this portion of the Kennebec River to all fishing except fly fishing, and to enable passage as an emergency so that it would become effective before this fly fishing season began rather than in the middle of the season.
